



DEMOCRACY FOR BURMA ALLIANCE

A REQUEST TO SPDC MILITARY REGIME TO STOP ATROCITIES ON ETHNIC NATIONALITIES

We, all democracy-loving citizens of the world, have already known since from a long time ago that SPDC Regime's hard-line leader, Senior General Than Shwe, and his like-minded deputies have a plan to totally eliminate the opposition party National League for Democracy and other ethnic opposition groups, before forcibly approving a constitution which will legalize permanent military rule in Burma.

But now it has become very clear that SPDC military regime has plans not only to eliminate ethnic resistance forces but also to wipe out entire populations of ethnic minority groups in Burma.

Recently in Karen State, scores of villages have been abandoned and their inhabitants forced to flee into jungles. Some 11,000 people have fled their homes due to the onslaught by SPDC regime troops, the Free Burma Rangers said.

About 1,500 refugees have fled across the border to Thailand, and aid officials fear others will follow in coming months to swell the more than 140,000 already in Thai refugee camps.

And Karen National Union reported that the SPDC troops ban civilian populations from traveling, trips for buying food and going to work in their agricultural fields. They are shelling the villages with heavy weapons, force the villages to relocate, burn down the villages, orchards, forests, farms and rice barns, loot properties of the villagers, including Karen bronze drums which are cultural objects of the Karen people, plant landmines, subject the people, including women, children and old people, to forced labor, arrest, torture and kill suspects, commit rape of women etc. openly without restraint.

Moreover, according to Karen women Organization, SPDC troops are committing gross human rights violations and atrocities against the Karen people, including women and children, in their military operations in Toungoo, Nyaunglaybin and Papon Districts of Karen State, which has continue since September 2005 until today.

Villagers are forced to build motor roads, construct barracks and haul food supplies for the SPDC troops. They are forced to relocate away from their villages, while their rice barns, agricultural fields and homes are burned down. Thousands of people in the area have to abandon their homes and livelihood to flee and hide as internal refugees, and this number is likely to continue to increase dramatically.

If these atrocities and genocide go on endlessly, a time will come when United Nations has to send in international coalition troops to Burma to enforce a regime change and to save the poor suffering people from endless inhumane atrocities. And then, it will become unavoidable for SPDC generals to stand trial in International Criminal Court on genocide charges.

So, we here sternly request SPDC military generals to **STOP ATROCITIES IN ETHNIC AREAS IMMEDIATELY.**
